Day and Night

Literacy



Using Book Week, November 27th to 1st December, we will be exploring various text to encourage our enjoyment of reading. We will use this as a learning opportunity to explore 'writers craft' where pupils are talking about text, giving opinions and justifying answers. They will be encouraged to use prior learning and learning from each other during these discussions.

Our aim is to transfer our learning about writers craft in Book Week to our own writing. We will also be looking at Poetry and using adjectives in our written work. Consolidation of capital letters and full stops will continue with the introduction of question marks.

The children will be preparing a talk on a celebration or special occasion in their life Further details to follow.

Maths

We will be exploring 2D and 3D shapes by designing and making rockets.

Our theme creates a super learning opportunity for looking at time. We will be investigating months, seasons, o'clock and half past times and so on.

Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s will continue as will learning and consolidating our 'Beat That' number bonds. The children should be confident with 1+1, 2+2, 3+3, 4+4, 5+5, 2+1, 2+3, 1+9. Building on from here we will be looking at making 10, 2+8, 3+7, 4+6 and doubles 6+6, 7+7, 8+8, 9+9.

Your help at home is much appreciated and makes a big difference. A little and often is the recommended way of committing knowledge and skills to the children's long term memory.



Circles: Finishing off numbers to 100 and extending their understanding of number stories to 15.

Squares: Continuing with numbers to 100 and developing their understanding of number stories to 15

Triangles: Numbers to 20 including reading number names and odd & even numbers. Consolidating addition and subtraction to 10 with the aim of moving up to 20 as their confidence grows.

Homework

Homework continues to go out on a Friday and collected in the following Thursday. Spelling test and Maths 'Beat That' timing sheets will continue every week. Spelling test continues on Thursdays this term. On occasion there may be some topic homework or a maths sheet.
